3. Additional General Education requirements must be selected from areas outside the primary emphasis.
4. Additional degree requirement, 24 hours. Select elective courses in consultation with your advisor.
5. **Primary emphasis, 33 hours.** A minimum of 18 hours must be from courses with the same prefix. A minimum of 15 hours in the primary emphasis must be at the upper level (3000-4000) within the group.

**Secondary emphasis, 18 hours.** Hours must be selected from a group different than was selected as the primary emphasis. These 18 hours can be from different prefixes within the group.

*NOTE: A course in the general education core can be used in an emphasis but cannot be counted for both a general education requirement and an emphasis requirement.*

With the assistance of your advisor, select a primary and secondary emphasis from the four groups below.

**Group I: Humanities and the Arts.** Choose from courses in Art, Communication, English, World Languages, Graphic Design, History, Humanities\*, Music, Philosophy, Speech, Religion\*, Rhetoric and Writing, Theatre.

**Group II Natural Sciences and Mathematics.** Choose courses from Biology, Chemistry, Geology, Mathematics, Physical Science\*, Physics, Statistics\*, Information Technology.

**Group III-Social Sciences.** Choose Courses from Anthropology, Criminal Justice, Geography, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology.

**Group IV-Business May be used as Secondary Emphasis only.** Choose courses from Accounting, Economics, Finance, Management, Marketing, and Law.

*\* Disciplines may not be used for the 18 hour same prefix primary emphasis requirement but can be used to meet the 33 hour group requirement.*

**Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.**
