Step 1: Learning About the Programs

Step 3: Financial Aid Requirements

Before federal aid eligibility may be determined, the Financial Aid office must receive:

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Cost information for the trip from the Office of International Relations.

Step 4: Disbursement of Financial Aid Funds

Study Abroad/Away costs are associated with the specific term in which you enroll for the trip. All financial aid will be disbursed based on the scheduled disbursement date for that term. This means you will need to plan for any deposits that are due prior to the disbursement of financial aid. In addition, you may leave for the trip before the funds disburse. We recommend you sign up for direct deposit so you will have access to your funds as soon as possible.

Step 5: After the Trip

At the end of each term the Office of Financial Aid & Veteran's Benefits will check satisfactory academic progress on all grades received to date. It is important that you follow up with the Registrar or Office of International Relations to ensure your grades are posted.
