I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Emphasizes the hygienist's role in dental health education and public health. Examination of methods to assess the oral health status of communities including the theory and application regarding program assessment, planning, implementation, and evaluation.

B. Additional Information

This course is taught in two sections, both lecture and laboratory that meet weekly. The course will utilize lecture/discussions, collaborative research presentations, and individual development of community dental health education programs for adults and children, and participation in a sealant health promotion program and other community service projects. This is a web-enhanced course. Students are required to check the website routinely for online learning materials and general course announcements between scheduled lecture/lab times.
