Participants learn to recognize and respond to life-threatening emergencies using skills of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), use of an automated external defibrillator (AED), and relief of foreign-body obstruction. American Heart Association guidelines for BLS and CPR for healthcare providers are followed.

II. Student Learning Outcomes

A. Subject Matter

Upon completion of this course, the student will:

- 1. Assess a respiratory situation and activate the Emergency Medical System.
- 2. Provide first response treatment in most respiratory emergencies.
- 3. Assist in providing respiratory emergency treatment.
- 4. Perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation in a respiratory emergency situation.
