I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

Discussion, directed readings, research, and writing on selected issues. Advanced study of a topic in Arkansas history chosen by instructor; includes a major research and writing project incorporating the goals of identifying a problem; establishing a thesis, gathering, evaluating, and analyzing evidence, and writing in an appropriate scholarly format. May be repeated, when topics differ, or for a total of six hours.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Utilize techniques for research, writing, and the formation of a thesis.
- 2. Present scholarly, written work on a given topic of Arkansas history.
