I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description

This course emphasizes critical thinking in the care of acutely/critically ill adults with content including a theoretical basis of psychiatric nursing. Students in this course will complete a total of 135 clinical hours in a variety of critical care and psychiatric care settings.

B. Additional Information

This course provides students with the opportunity to apply nursing skills while providing care to the adult client with critical health issues and to study common psychiatric disorders and their treatment. The focus will be on identifying common medical/surgical problems, responding with appropriate nursing interventions, and evaluating patient outcomes. Students will incorporate pharmacology, nutrition therapy, prevention, restoration, and health promotion as they pertain to nursing care of clients in community, inpatient, and critical care settings.

II. Student Learning Outcomes

A. Subject Matter

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Apply knowledge of the nursing process when providing holistic and compassionate care for critically ill adult clients and those with a psychiatric/mental health disorder.
2. Implement moral, ethical and legal concepts in caring for critically ill adult clients and those with a psychiatric/mental health disorder.

3. Integrate health promotion and prevention in the nursing care of critically ill adult clients and those with a psychiatric/mental health disorder.
4. Demonstrate accountability and responsibility in a professional manner.
5. Use effective therapeutic communication as an essential nursing skill.
