I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description:

Students develop and apply basic, intermediate, and advanced nursing skills during 30 campus lab hours with demonstration, practice, simulation, with clinical practice examinations. Students are introduced to nursing diagnoses, with emphasis on major nursing concepts and fundamental skills; application is accomplished during 45 hours in a clinical setting. The course provides 75 total campus lab/clinical hours.
