I. Course Information

A. Catalog Description: Focuses on the care of women along the health and illness continuum. Students apply the nursing process to address care of the normal pregnancy, high-risk pregnancy, and women's health issues and healthy and high-risk newborns. This course includes 90 hours in the clinical setting.

B. Additional Course Description: The course will be presented utilizing multiple teaching/learning strategies.

II. Student Learning Outcomes

A. Subject Matter:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Utilize critical thinking in addressing the care of the normal pregnancy; high-risk pregnancy; care of the healthy newborn and women's health issues.
2. Integrate the use of nursing research in the care of the normal pregnancy; high-risk pregnancy; care of healthy newborn and women's health issues.
3. Engage in various forms of age-appropriate communication to address care of the woman and pregnant client throughout the lifespan.
4. Promote leadership and management responsibilities while applying the nursing process to address care of women throughout the lifespan.
5. Advocate health promotion activities in the nursing care of women.
6. Promote the role of the professional nurse in interacting and caring for women.
