A. Catalog Description:

The course focuses on the care of children along the health and illness continuum. Students apply the nursing process to address care of the well-child, child with acute, chronic, and/or life-threatening conditions. This course includes 90 hours in the clinical setting.

The course will be presented utilizing multiple teaching/learning strategies.
